Wotan craves the ring, but, bound by his own laws, he can't retrieve it himself. With a mortal woman he has twins, Siegmund and Sieglinde, and hopes Siegmund will become the free agent he needs to take the ring.

Die Walküre has become the most performed of Richard Wagner's four-opera cycle Der Ring des Nibelungen, loved and admired for its nuanced and intelligent exploration of complex family entanglements, expressed through music of astonishing power.
