You, The Apprentice: You're Fired, Bake Off: Extra Slice, and Live at the Apollo.

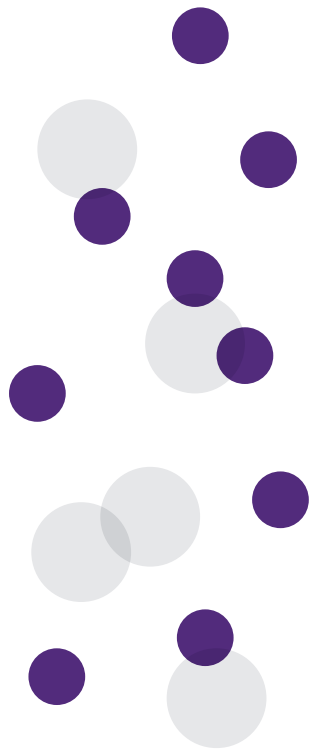

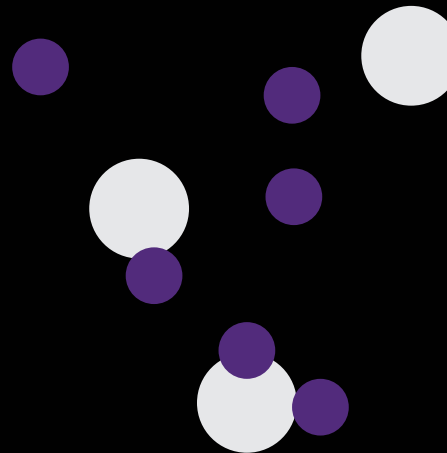

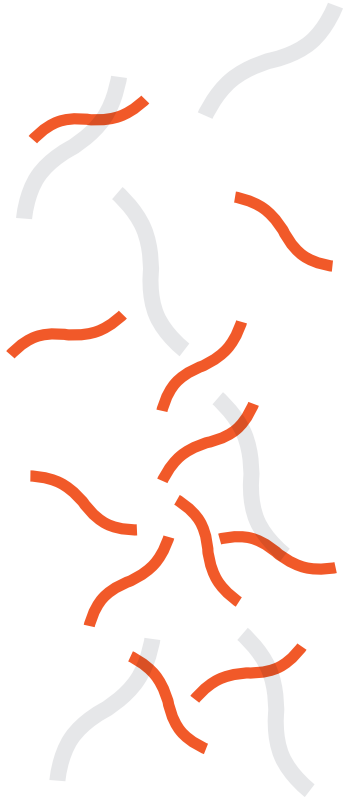

## EXHIBITION ON SCREEN - YOUNG PICASSO

Many films have dealt with Picasso's later years – the art, the affairs and the wide circle of friends. But where did this all begin?

Three cities play a key role: Malaga, Barcelona and Paris. The film explores the influence of each on the artist using behind-the-scenes access to some of the world's greatest galleries and museums. It focuses on specific artworks from these early years, looking carefully at two key early periods – the so-called Blue Period and Rose Period – and on to Les Femmes d'Alger, which Picasso painted aged just 25.

It is directed by Christof Loy and conducted by Antonio Pappano, Music Director of The Royal Opera.

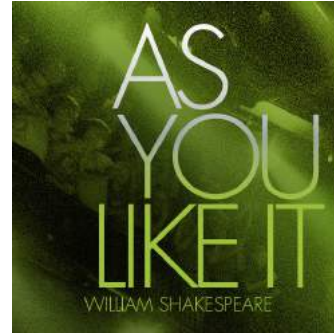


## EXHIBITION ON SCREEN – REMBRANDT

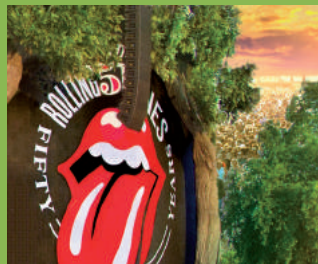
