College Street Technical Services CIC reserve the right to make amendments as appropriate. The decision of the technical managers is final, and will be made in accordance with Health & Safety regulations. College Street Technical Services CIC remain responsible for the technical aspects of the building while visiting companies are present.

WORKING REGULATIONS

It is essential that the following regulations and restrictions are noted by all visiting companies. Please ensure that any relevant personnel are made aware of the following:

Working Time Regulations

Please note that in accordance with Working Time Regulations 1998, an 11 hour break between working shifts must be scheduled for all members of staff.

Furthermore, suitable breaks must be scheduled within shifts to ensure the health and welfare of all staff. If in doubt with regards to any aspect of the working schedule, please contact the Technical Management. All schedules must be agreed in advance.

Noise at Work Regulations

Please note that in accordance with the Noise at Work Regulations 1989, the Control of Noise at Work Regulations 2005, and for the benefit and care of all staff and members of the public, Nottingham Arts Theatre and College Street Technical Services CIC reserves the right to monitor and, if necessary, limit the sound levels for any given performance.

Loading and Unloading Guidelines

The Nottingham Arts Theatre Code of Practice for loading and unloading is included in this document (Appendix A).

It is the responsibility of the visiting company to ensure that all relevant staff are made aware of this Code of Practice and that all relevant activities are carried out in accordance with the Code.



UNLOADING AND PARKING RESTRICTIONS

LOAD-IN:

Bar doors

Single width door. 780mm x 2000mm

Main doors

Double doors 1000mm wide, but tight turns negate the use of these doors for long pieces of set.

Please refer to stage dimensions and technical plans for more information, and contact the Technical Manager to discuss your specific requirements.

A site visit is recommended for companies who have not previously worked in the Arts Theatre. Visits should be arranged in advance of any production arriving at the theatre.

PARKING:

The Theatre does not have any parking spaces. Local parking for cars is metered and time limited. The nearest multi-storey car park is The Victoria Centre Car Park or Lace Market Car Park. More parking information can be found on the City Council's website https://www.nottinghamcity.gov.uk/parkingpermits

Light Goods Vehicles (vans/cars etc) can be reversed up to our bar door. Larger vehicles have to be unloaded in George Street.

All vehicles will need to be promptly removed once (un)loaded, as traffic wardens regularly patrol the area.



AUDITORIUM

No alterations can be made that would affect the normal seating capacity of the auditorium without prior discussion with the theatre management.

Maximum capacity 270

267 seats plus 3 wheelchair spaces Plus 4 house seats held not for sale

ORCHESTRA PIT

The orchestra pit has a curved frontage, with one exit/entrance from the under-stage corridor. The pit is in two sections: half is under-stage, half is covered by removable stage decks and forms the forestage when covered.

Full Depth 9.6m wide x 1.45m deep

Rear under-stage section 7.4m wide x 1m deep x 2m high

Height from Stage to Auditorium level 0.95m Height from Stage to Pit floor Level 2.01m

Orchestral equipment:

The theatre can provide chairs for the orchestra, however we do not have any music stands or lighting for the pit during shows.

There is a screen semi-permanently rigged on the circle bar at the back of the auditorium, and cameras are available that can be patched through to provide cast with view of an MD. Additional screens are also available, so that an MD can have a view of the stage.

STAGE

Due to the historic nature of the Arts Theatre buildings, the stage is not full width all the way to the back wall. The last few meters of stage are cut off on stage left by an external wall. This area is usually used as storage for dance towers and excess masking flats but can be made use of for entrances behind sets, or sets can extend back into it provided they are not full stage width. If this space is used for production purposes, the stored items will need to be rehoused in the stage wings, which will need to be allowed for in scenery storage plans. Please see the technical plans for more details.

The stage is a non-sprung wooden floor without rake.

Cross-over is usually via the under-stage. If a fast stage-level crossover is required, please adjust your hanging plot accordingly.

FLYING AND RIGGING

Flying at the Nottingham Arts Theatre is a mix of manual hemp lines and hand winch bars. Although there are fly bars, there is no fly tower and so it is impossible to fly set or cloths out so that they can no longer be seen.

Grid Height 7.1m

Maximum bar height 6.5m

Length of bars 9m

Outside diameter of bars 48mm/2"

All hemp bars safe working load 50 kg

Winch bars safe working load 150 kg

Please note – due to safe working loads as listed above, and the additional complexities involved, the rigging of aerial performance equipment or performer live flying equipment is not possible and is prohibited.

Flying operation is from stage left, fly gallery level for lines 1-13, stage right for lines 14-16. House tab control is from SR wing / DSM position. All flying must be done under the instruction and supervision of College Street Technical Services CIC (all technicians are appropriately trained and qualified).

Below is the standard hanging plot for the Arts Theatre (remains subject to change). This will need to be restored on the get out of any show that changes any bar use.

Please consult with College Street Technical Services CIC prior to your show with any rigging or flying requirements.

Both male and female toilets are accessed off the under-stage corridor.

Please be aware that there is no lift access back stage at the theatre; all levels are connected by stairs.

The Nottingham Arts Theatre operates with a standard lighting rig to allow us to accommodate one off productions and music nights. This lighting rig will be in situ at the start of any production and needs to be returned to this state before the end of the final call of a show run. Please see technical plans for more details.

Please supply any show specific lighting plans to the Technical Manager at least 2 weeks before production load in date.

APPENDIX A: Nottingham Arts Theatre: Code of Practice for loading/unloading and rigging.

Staffing

- The visiting company must ensure that a competent person is appointed to supervise the unloading and loading of the truck(s) or wagon(s).
- ALL crew will be competent, well rested at the beginning of the shift, and sober throughout.
- ALL crew will follow Nottingham Arts Theatre requirements for Personal Protective Equipment and will wear protective footwear throughout any loading, unloading or rigging.
- Hard hats must be worn on stage whenever any fly bars are moving (These are available in-house).
- There is a protective barrier system in place to restrict access to the stage to necessary crew whilst construction is taking place. These must be adhered to by all crew and company.
- Before any work is undertaken, all present crew/company must have a brief 'toolbox' safety introduction/talk with the house crew. This should take no more than 5 minutes and will cover basic health and safety requirements of the venue and fire procedures.
- Once full company arrive, and before any rehearsals can begin, a brief safety talk must be given by the crew to the company.
- Sufficient breaks must be scheduled. Technicians require a half hour break around lunchtime between 12:00-14:00 and a full one hour break in the evening which CANNOT include the half before the show. If in doubt, please consult with the technical management.
- Sufficient crew must be provided or requested of Nottingham Arts Theatre in advance. If loading/unloading is deemed unsafe as a result of insufficient crew, Nottingham Arts Theatre and/or College Street Technical Services CIC reserves the right to delay any unsafe activity until such time as additional crew can be deployed.
- College Street Technical Services CIC, in agreement with Nottingham Arts Theatre, provide two skilled and experienced technicians for ALL show calls, regardless of touring crew.

Loading/unloading

- The visiting company will have ensured the truck is safely packed, with no dangerously balanced items at risk of falling and injuring any member of any crew. Ideally a plan of the truck, showing the distribution of items within the truck, will be provided in advance (or at least be carried by the supervising member of staff unloading the truck).
- The visiting company will have ensured that boxes, skips and flight cases are safely packed to avoid any unbalanced loads. Weight should be indicated on each item.
- The visiting company will provide any necessary lifting equipment (example: forklift truck with driver) in advance of their arrival (should there not be an adequate tail lift or ramp provided on their truck).

Reporting

- All accidents MUST be reported immediately to a member of Nottingham Arts
 Theatre or College Street Technical Services CIC who will ensure that the relevant
 personnel are informed immediately, in order that all Health and Safety
 procedures can be followed.
- College Street Technical Services CIC technicians are all qualified to a minimum of Emergency First at Work, however visiting companies should ensure that they have appropriate first aid qualified staff available if necessary.
- Near misses MUST be reported to the Technical Manager for Nottingham Arts Theatre, and to the visiting company's Technical Director / Company Manager.
